

## 805 - CDM Regulation

**Duration:** 1 day

**Suitable for:** Managers, clients, those in overseeing organisations and contractors in public lighting,

signs, traffic signals and/or other Highway Electrical specialist areas

Course aim: This course aims to provide an overview of the CDM regulations, including the

responsibilities of the duty holders at each stage of a project. It also aims to give an understanding of how implementation of these regulations impacts on the overall management and co-ordination of health, safety and welfare throughout all stages of a project, and the associated benefits in terms of the reduction of accidents and ill health
